The most recent report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change affirmed and strengthened our conclusion.

This is incorrect. Although the project has never been realized, the legislation enabling it still stands. In the intervening years, we have assembled formidable collections

of genetic as well as medical data contributed by hundreds of thousands of participants in our research. But the ability to assemble longitudinal, population-based medical information would undoubtedly be a unique and powerful resource.
